In response to the limited access to campus for the fall semester, we have partnered up with ECU to offer 3 Fellowships to undergraduate students who are interested and/or have experience with Printmaking. Materials will be provided, including plates (linoleum or woodblock), paper, and packaging. Patio Press is committing to print a small edition of 10 to 15 prints, as well as to showcase the work of the awardees on our Instagram and website. In addition, a print from the edition will be included in special collections archive at the ECU library.

HOW TO APPLY

- Tell us a bit about yourself, about your journey as a student at ECU and your relationship to printmaking. (100 words max)
- What is your proposed project: describe your intentions + guidelines for us. (100 words max)
- Include a sketch of your proposed print
- Include a link to your website/artist Instagram if applicable.

- Sept 30, 2020 Winners announced, materials distributed to students.
- Oct 15, 2020 Plates/blocks must be received/delivered to Patio Press.
- Nov 25, 2020 Editions are printed and shipped back to students.
- Dec 5, 2020 Works published on Patio Press, signed for the library archive.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE

Undergraduate students currently enrolled in any program at Emily Carr University of Art and Design.

LOGISTICS / TERMS

We offer single color (black) printing of a small edition of prints (12 max) of a linocut, woodblock, or wood engraving not exceeding 10"x10". Blocks/plates will be printed on white Stonehenge or BFK paper and mailed back/dropped off at the university for the students to pick up. We are open to irregular / special / unconventional printing techniques for a varied edition, if specified in the proposal we can correspond for more details. One print will be kept in the Patio Press collection as well as the ECU Library archive.

Patio Press is a project developed by ECU instructors and artists Sara-Jeanne Bourget and Mark Johnsen in response to the COVID-19 social distancing regulations.
