Summer Teens Indigenous Scholarship Application

Continuing Studies at Emily Carr University of Art + Design is pleased support young artists by providing access to high-quality art education and fostering a creative community. We are pleased to offer students of Indigenous ancestry tuition scholarships to attend the Summer Teens Programs and further their educational studies in art, media and design. Scholarship applications can only be submitted when Summer Teens programs are open for registration. Scholarship awards are applied to tuition only, and may not be used towards transportation, meals, or housing costs.

Scholarship Application Eligibility Criteria

The **Summer Teens Indigenous Scholarships** are available to students of Indigenous ancestry. Applications will be judged by a Selection Committee of experienced arts educators, artists, designers and creative practitioners on the quality of individual application submissions.

Scholarships are allocated to each Summer Teens program as follows:

- 2x Scholarships awarded to students in the Junior Arts Institute
- 2x Scholarships awarded to students in the **Summer Institute for Teens**
- 1x Scholarship awarded to a student in the Creative Futures Institute

Evaluation Criteria: Attributes the Selection Committee is looking for include:

- Curiosity and open-mindedness
- Capacity for collaboration, experimentation and exploration
- Engagement with a range of media and a love of material exploration
- A passion for art and design
- Commitment to attending all scheduled sessions of their Summer Teens program of choice

Submission: All applications must be completed and submitted online using the Teen Programs <u>registration</u> <u>application form</u>. Please note, incomplete submissions will not be considered.

Deadline: Saturday, March 1, 2025

Application Requirements

Student information: first and last name, preferred name, email address, phone number A personal statement (max. 300 words) highlighting the applicant's interest in their chosen Summer Teens program and why they would like to join the program. Consider addressing the following questions:

- o What draws you to this program?
- Why are you passionate about visual art or design?
- How was visual art or design shaped your life and creative journey?
- What do you hope to gain from joining your chosen Summer Teens program?
