

A technician can help install the iPad in the front frame, and help you set up your project on the iPad using the Kiosk Pro app.




Mark your space for install.






Kiosk Pro App

The exhibition iPads come with an app called **Kiosk Pro** that makes it easy to display videos, websites, PDFs, or image slideshows. A technician can help you configure the kiosk settings, and lock your project for the exhibition.

The project files must be loaded from a computer, with a cable.

We will have cables and adapters available for this purpose during the installation days.





Kiosk Pro can easily display:

- Looping video
- PDF
- Website from online URL
- Folder with images for a slideshow
- Folder with all the files for a local website (images, html, css, js, etc)
