## Overview of SSHRC grants available to Emily Carr faculty:

**Connection Grants** to support events and outreach activities geared toward short-term, targeted knowledge mobilization initiatives. These events and activities represent opportunities to exchange research knowledge and to engage on research issues of value to those participating.

- Project duration: 1 year
- Deadline: four times a year on February 1, May 1, August 1 and November 1
- Award amount: \$7,000 to \$25,000, and up to \$50,000 for other outreach activities; higher amounts for outreach activities may be considered if well justified

**Insight Development Grants** to support research in its initial stages. The grants enable the development of new research questions, as well as experimentation with new methods, theoretical approaches and/or ideas. Funding is provided for short-term research development projects of up to two years, proposed by individuals or teams. These awards are not intended to support ongoing initiatives.

- Project duration: 1 to 2 years
- Deadline: Beginning of February, check with the Research + Industry Office
- Award amount: \$7,000 up to \$75,000

**Insight Grants** to support long-term research initiatives of up to five years. Funding is available for both emerging and established scholars to enable them to address complex issues pertaining to individuals and societies, and to further our collective understanding.

- Project duration: 3 to 5 years
- Deadline: Beginning of October, check with the Research + Industry Office
- Award amount: \$7,000 to \$400,000

**Knowledge Synthesis Grants** to support synthesis of existing research knowledge and the identification of knowledge gaps

- Project duration: 1 year
- Deadline: Early January, check with the Research + Industry Office
- Award amount: \$25,000

**Partnership Engage Grants** to respond to the objectives of the <u>Insight</u> program and the <u>Connection</u> program. They provide short-term and timely support for partnered research activities that will inform decision-making at a single partner organization from the public, private or not-for-profit sector. The small-scale, stakeholder-driven partnerships supported

through the Partnership Engage Grants are meant to respond to immediate needs and time constraints facing organizations in non-academic sectors.

- Project duration: 1 year
- Deadline: four times a year on September 15, December 15, March 15, June 15
- Award amount: \$7,000 to \$25,000

**Partnership Development Grants** to develop research and related activities in the social sciences and humanities, including knowledge mobilization and the meaningful involvement of students and new scholars by fostering new research partnership activities involving existing and/or potential partners or to design and test new partnership approaches for research and/or related activities.

- Project duration: 1 to 3 years
- Deadline: Late November, check with the Research + Industry Office
- Award amount: \$75,000 to \$200,000

**Partnership Grants** to support new and existing formal research and/or knowledge mobilization partnerships over four to seven years.

**Note:** There is a two-phase application process for Partnership grants. Applicants must apply to the <u>Partnership Grants Letter of Intent</u> first and, if approved, they will be invited to apply to the Partnership Grant.

- Project duration: 4 to 7 years
- Deadline: Early February, check with the Research + Industry Office
- Award amount: for Stage 1, Letter of Intent, up to \$20,000. For Stage 2, Formal Application (by invitation only), maximum \$500,000 per year, up to \$2.5 million in total.

**Partnership Grant Letter of Intent:** Partnership Grant proposals are expected to respond to the objectives of the <u>Insight program</u>, or the <u>Connection program</u>, or a combination thereof. Proposals exclusively for partnered research training initiative are expected to respond, instead, to the objectives of the <u>Talent program</u>. Please see the <u>Insight</u>, <u>Connection</u> and <u>Talent</u> program descriptions for more details.

- Project duration: 4 to 7 years
- Deadline: Mid-February, check with the Research + Industry Office
- Award amount: for Stage 1, Letter of Intent, up to \$20,000. For Stage 2, Formal Application (by invitation only), maximum \$500,000 per year, up to \$2.5 million in total.
